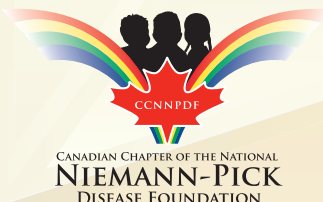

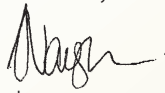
The CCNNPDF has had an exciting 2010. Earlier this year Health Canada announced its approval of the drug Zavesca (miglustat) as the first authorized treatment for neurological symptoms of the rare, genetic and terminal condition, Niemann-Pick Type C.

Zavesca is not a cure for Niemann-Pick Disease Type C (NPC), but it has shown promise in treating symptoms related to NPC and in slowing the progression of the disease for some patients. Zavesca has also received the approval of Ontario health authorities for governmental reimbursement of the drug's cost for use in patients with NPC. Ontario is the only province that has formally approved such reimbursement.

As the first-ever approved treatment for Niemann-Pick Disease Type C, Zavesca provides a ray of hope for families who are desperate to extend and improve their children's quality of life.

Even with the approval of Zavesca, we must soldier on in the battle to find the cure that will eradicate Niemann-Pick Disease completely. The Lieggio's as leaders, continue to do battle in memory of their precious son Luke, to help us find that elusive cure - one day their efforts will pay off.
